The staffs have earned Pacemaker, IHSA, NISPA, and CSPA honors many times. We've had seven IHSA individual state champions and the journalism team has finished second in state twice. In 2013, HHS student Marek Makowski was named Illinois Journalist of the Year and Principal Dave Johnson was named Administrator of the Year, both by the IJEA.
